


Sea-Folk Museum has a collection of some sixty-thousand exhibits about sea - Ama divers, fishing, wooden boats, sea festivals, sea's environment and so on. (Including 6879 pieces of national significant tangible folk cultural assets). About 90 wooden boats which have been collected from the whole country and the most numerous documentation that related to Ama is one of the attractions. Moreover, The buildings, which were designed by Hiroshi Naito, were selected Japan Architectural Institute Award and one of the public hundred building."









SEA - FOLK MUSEUM is the place which passes on the culture of our home-fishing villages.



Can you feel a breath of wood from the 100 wooden boats? The boats were made by carpenters, sailed long years with fishermen and sailors, and rest in peace now.








